## **PSHE Curriculum**

I am writing to update you on the topics Year 12 will be studying in PSHE in the coming weeks. This half term, Year 12 will be learning about **planning for the future** and will be taught:

- how to assess strengths, interests, values, and skills to set realistic, aspirational goals
- how to evaluate the options available in education, training and employment post-18
- how to evidence strengths and skills and use this when applying and interviewing for future roles and opportunities
- how to evaluate the changing patterns and trends in the labour market, locally, nationally and internationally, and benefit from potential opportunities
- how to evaluate the financial advantages, disadvantages and risks relating to post-18 options
- how to evaluate the potential gains and risks of different credit/debt arrangements and repayment implications, including student loans

PSHE involves both written work and group-based discussion work, and we really hope your child will enjoy exploring the range of topics that PSHE offers. Resources that we use are sourced from the PSHE Association and therefore approved by the Department for Education.
